Casper Vanzandt died at his home on North Morton Street Wednesday afternoon.

He was a victim of the la grippe. About two weeks ago he was taken with this disease and complications soon developed that created the greatest alarm. He grew continually worse until Wednesday afternoon when he passed quietly away. Mr. Vanzandt was one of the best known citizens in Bloomington. For years he had been in the undertaking business here and in that way became acquainted with almost everybody. He was an honest, upright man, conscientious in all his dealings. He was an earnest member of the Walnut Street Presbyterian Church and a prominent member of the Mason Order of this city.

Casper Vanzandt was born in Newton Hamilton, Mifflin Co., Pa., in 1819. Left an orphan at four years of age, he early began the battle of life for himself. He found life full of struggles, yet ever met its difficulties and enjoyed its successes with a calm and earnest heart. He came to Lafayette, Ind., in 1848, where he followed his trade, that of saddler, until he removed with his family to Corydon, Ind. He was married to Elizabeth Kelly in 1846. Death claimed one of his sons in the prime of his young manhood. He leaves a wife and four children. He came to Bloomington in 1873. Here his manner of life is known to all. His good name remains a precious heritage to his family and "his children rise up and call him blessed." Early in life he united with the Presbyterian Church. Just 16 years from the day he connected himself with the Presbyterian Church in this place, he entered into his rest. Surely, "death with his sickle keen" has been busy in our midst. With other full ripe sheaves he has been gathered into the garner of God. "Oh that men...
